PSED/ Citizenship / Bucket Filling

Our SEAL topics will be 'Going for Goals Good to be me'. We will continue to be Bucket Fillers and to focus on the Staveley values, which are Resilience, Compassion, Friendship and Respect. We will recycle within our classroom and learn how to look after our school outdoor environment.

Literacy

Daily phonics sessions will take place every day for all children. Spelling common exception words, days of the week and months of the year. We will write sentences using capital letter, finger spaces and full stops and beginning to use exclamation marks and question marks in our writing.

We will continue to practise our cursive letter formation and the correct orientation of letters and numbers. We will form capital letters correctly.

Non-fiction – We will learn about and describe Australian animals. We will write riddles about animals that will include question marks. We will make a survival guide to the outback.

Fiction – We will read, plan and write our own Aboriginal dreamtime stories.

Poetry – We will write poems about animals and begin to use adjectives.

Reading - Children will have many opportunities to listen to a range of genres with a focus on stories about animals and Dreamtime stories. We will continue to listen to the children read individually, working on fluency, expression and applying phonic knowledge. We will also be working on verbal and written comprehension skills.

Mathematics

We shall be studying place value to 100 and ordering numbers alongside practicing our addition and subtraction skills. We will solve missing number, true and false and spot the mistake problems to help develop reasoning and problem solving. We will count in 2's, 5's and 10's. We shall be doubling amounts and sharing equally. We will draw arrays to help us begin to make links with multiplication.

We will learn about fractions by finding halves and quarters of amounts and shapes. We will understand what the term 'whole' means. In measure we will learn to tell the time focusing on 'o'clock' and 'half past'.

Science

We will identify different plants and trees and begin to understand the terms 'evergreen' and 'deciduous.' We will learn about humans and animals. Naming and labelling parts of the human body. We will begin to categorise animals into reptiles, amphibians, mammals, birds and fish. We will learn the meaning of the words omnivore, herbivore and carnivore.

Computing

We shall recognise common uses of information technology and begin to create and manipulate digital content by using Pic Collage to make posters. We will begin to learn to use the internet safely. We will play games to help support our learning in Maths and Phonics.

Trips and Visits/Special Events

Spring walk around Staveley to Bluebell Wood.

Muddy Mondays

Our Muddy Monday sessions will mainly link with our Science, Art and the world around us. We will look at seasonal changes and the weather. We will make bark rubbings of different trees. We will go on a Spring scavenger hunt.

RE Taught as a discrete session

The children will learn what it means to belong to Christianity and about some special times and celebrations. Work will follow the Cumbrian Agreed Syllabus.

Physical Education

We shall be practicing our basic movements, agility and coordination. We will play team games.

Geography

We will locate Australia on a map of the world. We will compare the climates of Staveley and Australia by looking at temperatures on a weather forecast. We will learn about the outback and The Great Barrier reef. We will learn about life in Australia and how it differs with life in the UK. We will pack a suitcase to take on a trip to Australia. We will draw and label the contents.

Art and Design

We will draw flowers using pencil and watercolour. We will learn about Aboriginal artwork and cave paintings. We will create our own Aboriginal art using different tools. We will learn how to mix earthy colours.

Music

We will design and make our own musical instruments. We will follow the Charanga music programme.
