<p><b>Have a look at the White Rose Maths website for short tutorial videos to go with the lessons (Y2, week 10, 29<sup>th</sup> June).</b> I have attached the worksheets and we will be recapping weighing and measuring capacity.</p> <p>Have a go at a few pages of the Measure home learning booklet I have attached. This can be done over the next two weeks as our measures work will continue next week with time telling.</p> <p>This week lends itself to lots of baking, practising those weighing and reading scales skills.</p> <p>Make a refreshing summer fruity drink. Measure each fruity ingredient in millilitres and then write out the recipe. Share it on our Padlet and we can all try and make it.</p> <p>In the bath or paddling pool, play with measuring jugs, filling different sized containers and measuring their capacity.</p> <p>Use some kitchen or bathroom scales to weigh different objects. Look carefully at the scale.</p> <p>Do a page or two of the Year 2 Summer Maths booklet attached last week.</p> <p>Play on Numbots or Top Marks Maths to keep your mental arithmetic skills alive.</p>	<p>Research some famous pirates by reading the powerpoint and have a go at completing the reading comprehension activities</p> <p>Write a wanted poster for one of the pirates you have learnt about. Don't forget to write a good character description including adjectives and commas in a list sentences. You will need to write about their crimes too.</p> <p>Be the teacher and correct the spelling mistakes on the attached sheets. All of these words should be familiar as they are our common exception words.</p> <p>Practise your joined up <b>handwriting</b>. Sheets attached two weeks ago. You do not need to do them all at once! Aim for one sheet a week over the next 10 weeks.</p> <p>Have a look at the Collins Big Cat or Oxford Owl websites and <b>read</b> a book.</p>	<p><b>Pirates!</b> Have a read through the All about pirates and Pirate Ships powerpoint information.</p> <p>Label the parts of a pirate ship.</p> <p>Design your own pirate flag.</p> <p>Have a go at the pirate map grid references activity. Then make your own pirate map with co-ordinates.</p> <p>Make a paper pirate hat and eye patch and talk like a pirate for the day.</p> <p>Relax while colouring in some pirate mindfulness.</p> <p>Design and build a pirate ship.</p>
