What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2015/16 and 2016/17 to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the DfE and will see money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year for the next two years. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of the funding

At Staveley Primary School we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. In addition, it is considered that an innovative and varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all children.

The governors agree that the money must be used so that all children benefit regardless of their sporting ability. It's important that we use this money wisely, especially as the PE support we previously received from high schools will cease. We will continue to place a high priority on our PE provision and resources to further enhance the curriculum. Our Sports Funding allocation will enable us to continue and extend our provision through employing more sports professionals, entering into more competitive sports competitions and by training our staff to deliver in-house quality PE sessions.

Allocation of funds 2015-16

In 2015-16, the funds were allocated in the following ways:

PE Staff CPD

A specialist PE teacher from the local secondary school was employed to work one afternoon per week on a rolling schedule across the whole school. She was in school one afternoon per week and worked alongside two teachers each day. Classes rotated on a half termly basis. Her role was to model good practice, team teach, coach staff and develop our curriculum. In addition she audited our PE resources and provided additional curriculum support materials.

Swimming

A specialist swimming teacher was procured to provide CPD to those staff who took our children for swimming lessons. Similar to the model above her role was to work alongside each teacher in turn providing modelled lessons, teaching support and curriculum guidance. This was for one hour per week for the 12 weeks of lessons per year. Additionally we made it possible to provide additional swimming lessons for one Y6 child who had not reached the NC standard.

Competition

Funds were also used to provide additional specialist sports coaching in Football from the WFA. Cricket, Tag Rugby and Netball. This increased our competitive level. Some funds were also used to subsidise transport which enabled pupils to attend a series of weekly orienteering events. For a small school, we have produced a disproportionately high representation at area and county finals.
