

# Staveley CE Primary School Statutory Assessment 2018

# EYFS (end of Reception)

71% of our Reception children have reached a Good Level of Development

# Phonics (end of Year 1)

67% of our Year 1 children passed the Phonics Screening Check

## KS1 (end of Year 2)

## Reading

School - 89% at Expected Standard or above. 26% at Greater Depth

National – 75% at Expected. 26% at Greater Depth

## Writing

School - 79% at Expected Standard or above. 26% at Greater Depth

National – 70% at Expected. 16% at Greater Depth

#### Maths

School - 79% at Expected Standard or above. 32% at Greater Depth

National – 76% at Expected. 22% at Greater Depth

## KS2 (end of Year 6)

44% achieved the Expected Standard in Reading, Writing and Maths combined in the May 2018 SAT tests. 13% achieved Greater Depth in all 3 subjects combined.

Nationally, 64% of pupils reached the Expected Standard in Reading, Writing and Maths combined with 10% achieving Greater Depth.

## Reading

School - 69% at Expected Standard or above. 31% Greater Depth

National -75% at Expected. 28% at Greater Depth

## Writing

School - 75% at Expected Standard or above. 25% Greater Depth

National - 78% at Expected. 20% Greater Depth

#### Maths

School - 63% at Expected Standard or above. 25% Greater Depth

National - 25% at Expected. 24% Greater Depth

#### Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

School - 69% at Expected Standard or above. 25% Greater Depth

National - 78% at Expected 34% Greater Depth

#### Average Scaled Scores

Raw Scores are converted into a Scaled Score. A score of 100 means a child is working at the expected standard for a Year 6 child.

School - Reading 104.75 National - Reading 105.04

School - Maths 102.75 National - Maths 104.38

#### 2018 Progress Scores - Key Stage 1 to Key Stage 2

Reading -0.35

Writing -0.17

Maths -1.74

#### Interpreting progress scores

Progress scores will be centred around 0, with most schools within the range of -5 to +5.

• A score of 0 means pupils in this school on average do about as well as KS2 as those with similar prior attainment nationally.

• A positive score means pupils in this school on average do better at KS2 as those with similar prior attainment nationally.

• A negative score means pupils in this school on average do worse at KS2 as those with similar prior attainment nationally.

A negative score does not mean that pupils did not make any progress, rather it means they made less progress than other pupils nationally with similar starting points.
