At Staveley C of E Primary School we offer a curriculum which:

- Develops the whole person knowledge, skills, understanding, attitudes, creativity, values and spirituality
- Is inclusive and accessible by all
- Is broad, balanced and has rigorous progression in subject knowledge and skills
- Is filled with rich, first-hand, purposeful experiences
- Encourages use of outdoor environments and expertise beyond the classroom
- Is creative, flexible and responsive to individual needs and interests
- Embeds the principle of sustainability
- Has a local, national and global dimension
- Prepares our children for the future

Pupils are still working on the Early Learning Goals of the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum as they enter Year 1. There is a period in the Autumn Term where the majority of children progress to the National Curriculum.

The curriculum incorporates the statutory requirements of the new National Curriculum 2014 and our adventure experiences and opportunities best meet the learning and developmental needs of the pupils in our school.

The curriculum is underpinned by the school's spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of our pupils and their understanding of our core values of our society:

- Respect and obey the law.
- Respect the rights of others, including their right to their own opinions.
- Treat others with fairness.
- Look after themselves and their family.
- Look after the area in which they live and the environment.
- Always try our best at everything we do.
- Listen to each other.
- Treat each other with respect and value our differences.

We believe that this also underpins fundamental British values.

The outdoor environment and the local community are considered an opportunity for active learning for all our pupils. The school grounds have been developed so they can enrich different curriculum areas.

Adventure learning is an important part of our curriculum. The bespoke quality of our adventure experience is part of our school's unique offer to pupils. We believe that outdoor and adventurous activities give pupils the opportunity to challenge themselves as individuals and groups while in a supportive environment.

We feel that all our pupils should experience some of the unique benefits that being educated in a village within the National Park has to offer. By learning outdoors in our beautiful locality, pupils develop their own spirituality and appreciation of the environment. We also hope that they will see adventure activities as something they can do themselves out of school and in the future, if they wish.
